**Ian Mallach** is a nationally recognized advocate and scholar on housing, land use, community and economic development. Mallach is a senior fellow at the Center for Community Progress and teaches in the graduate city planning program at Pratt Institute in New York City. In addition, he is an author of *A Decent Home: Planning, Building and Preserving Affordable Housing* and *Bringing Buildings Back: From Vacant Properties to Community Assets*.
