- Nonprofit organization established in 1993 by the Homeless Committee of the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce.
- Develops, operates and manages innovative housing communities for individuals and families in need through a unique approach combining affordable housing with comprehensive, on-site supportive services.
- As the leading not-for-profit provider of supportive housing in Florida, Carrfour has supplied homes for more than 10,000 formerly homeless men, women and

Types of Housing Provided by Carrfour

- Supportive housing in a community developed and operated by Carrfour.
- Supportive housing in scattered site units throughout the community.
- Affordable (non-homeless) housing for families earning less than 60% AMI (Area Median Income).
- Mixed-income and mixed-use communities that incorporate innovative services to benefit the community such as libraries, farmers markets, and credit unions.

Royalton

- Historic downtown Miami hotel
 - originally built in 1923 renovated and restored into an affordable housing community
- 100 furnished apartments serving formerly homeless and low-income residents
- Amenities including wireless internet, a community/TV room, meeting facilities, a computer lab, and laundry facilities on each floor







Harvard House, North Miami Beach, Florida

Harvard House



- 56 newly-renovated affordable housing units
- 28 designated for residents with incomes at or below 50% of the AMI
- Amenities include a computer room, basketball court, gymnasium, playground, picnic area, car care area, and laundry room







Parkview Gardens, Liberty City, Florida

Parkview Gardens



- 60 apartments (one to three-bedrooms)
 designated for low-income families/individuals
 earning at or below 60% of the AMI
- 6 units set aside for those earning less than 33% of the AMI
- Includes six three-story residential buildings, a community center, parking garage, playground, gym, computer lab, library and picnic area






- 76 Apartments
- 38 reserved for formerly homeless families impacted by disabilities
- 38 for low-income families earning less than 60% AMI
- Exercise room, computer room, large terraces
- Miami-Dade County Library on ground floor
- Carrfour's main office on top floor

Verde Gardens




- Built on site of former
 Homestead Air Force Base
- 145 LEED-certified "green" townhomes for formerly homeless families
- 22-acre organic farm which includes a produce nursery and an on-site public farmer's market
- Supportive services integrate innovative farming techniques with much-needed job and life skills




- 100 apartments (efficiencies to four-bedroom)
- 50 units serving formerly homeless families
- 50 units serving elderly residents and low-income families
- All units have private terrace
- Supportive services help residents achieve independence
- Amenities include exercise facility, multi-purpose community room, and parking garage
