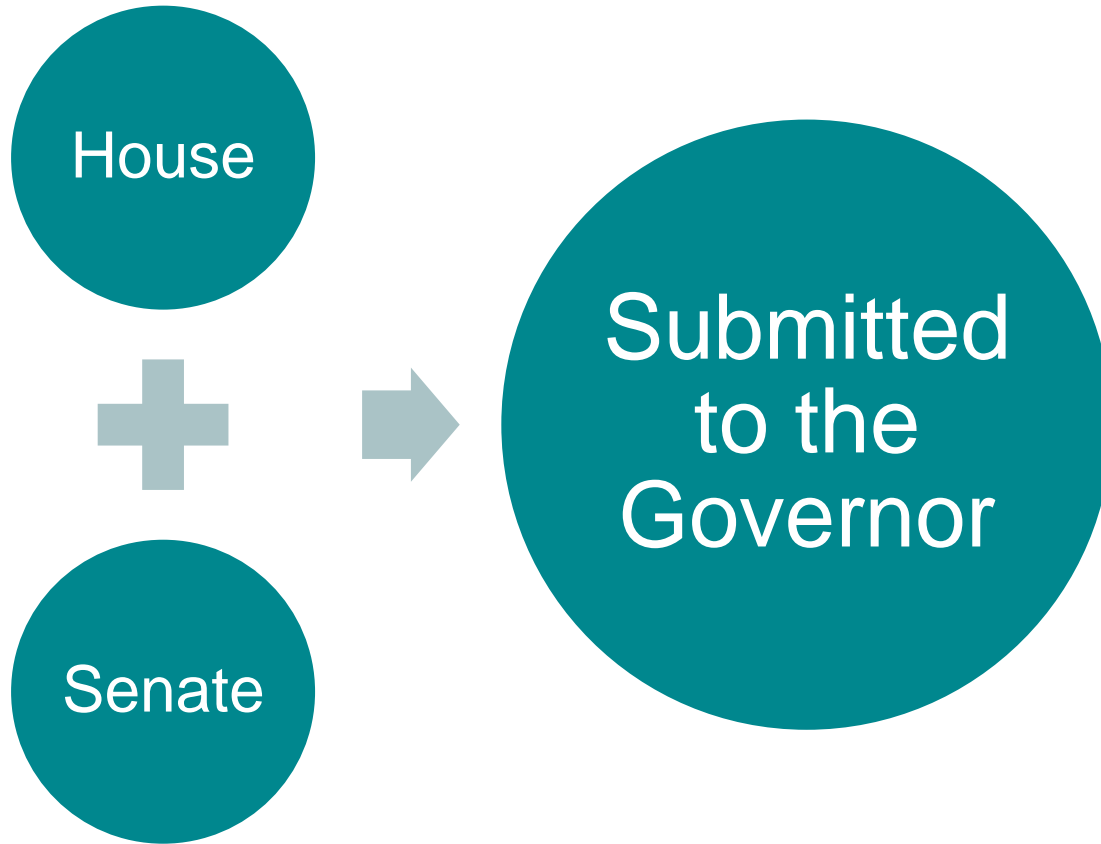

Dear Governor DeSantis:

Thank you so much for your support of using all the Sadowski state and local housing trust funds to help Florida's working families, as well as the elderly and persons with disabilities living on fixed incomes. I am writing to respectfully ask that you line item veto the Legislature's sweep of Sadowski Trust funds.

A line item veto from you would:

- **Send a message to the legislature that there is no point in sweeping the Sadowski trust funds to general revenue- as you will veto the sweep; and**
- **Leave those funds (\$125 million) in the Sadowski trust funds for appropriation next year.**

Governor DeSantis, you have distinguished yourself as a leader on this issue. We need you to put a stop to the tradition of sweeping the trust funds by using your line item veto authority to help us out of the housing crisis in Florida.

State Apartment Incentive Loan (SAIL)



State Apartment Incentive Loan



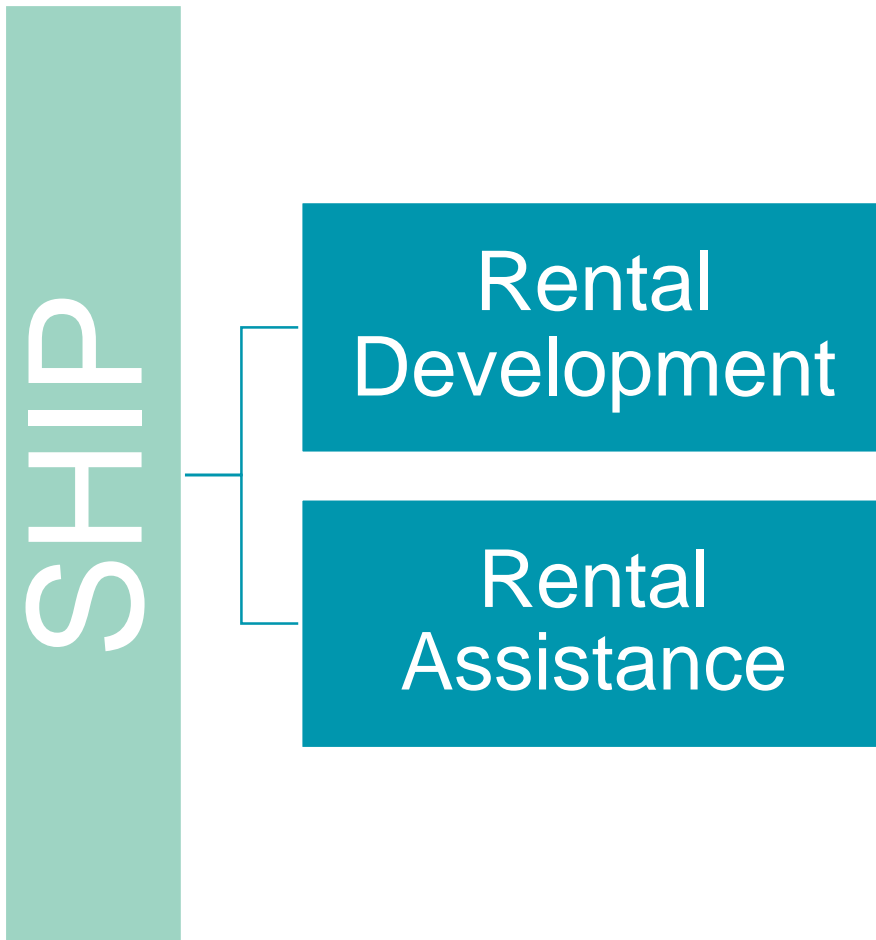
- Provides low-interest loans through FHFC's competitive process
- Available to individuals, public entities, non-profit organizations, for-profit organizations
- Bridges the gap between the development's primary financing and the total cost of the development

SAIL: Anticipated 2019-2020 Appropriation

- SAIL
 - \$39,040,000
- 10% of SAIL for competitive grant for housing for persons with developmental disabilities
- SAIL for Jacksonville Urban Core Workforce Housing Program
 - \$8,000,000



State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP)



- 65% of the funds to be spent on eligible homeownership activities
- 10% pays for SHIP administration
- 25% remains for Rental Housing

Other Homeless Related Bills

Homeless Statute Bill Re-Write

House Bill 1353

Senate Bill 1218

Passed House by a vote of 112-0

Died in the Senate

Did not pass during 2019 session

Senate Statute Re-Write

- Identical to House Bill + \$10 million doc stamp revenue for homeless challenge grant

Stop the Sweeps Bill

House Bill 1103

Senate Bill 70

Prevents sweeps of the Affordable Housing Trust Funds (SHIP/SAIL)

Did not pass during 2019 session

Homeless HMIS Public Records Exemption

House Bill 1071

Senate Bill 1346

Homelessness Counts and Databases

Did not pass during 2019 session
