



National Emergency Declared

- Pres. Trump declared a national emergency on Fri. March 13
- Unlocks the financial and coordination support under the Stafford Act
 - HHS is the lead.
 - Disaster Relief Fund Reimbursement; FEMA 75 percent cost share under category B of the Public Assistance Program
 - Category B: Emergency Protective Measures including:
 - Care, shelter, essential needs for humans affected by outbreak and spread of a pandemic
 - Social distancing measures; disinfection of facilities
 - Construction of tent testing sites
 - Provision of food, water, ice, and other essential items at central distribution points
 - Keep track of all your costs associated with COVID-19 response.



Congressional Action

- Today, the President signed the Families First Coronavirus Response Act
- Nothing related to housing but did include:
 - Increased funding for food banks, more flexibility in providing school lunches for kids, and other programs designed to provide food to lower-income households.
 - Paid sick leave for certain employers; new federal emergency paid leave benefit program.
 - Additional money for unemployment insurance.
- We expect housing-related elements to be included in the next relief package.



The Waters' Plan

- At least \$2,000/month for adults; \$1,000/month per child.
- Suspend all consumer and business credit payments.
- Suspend all negative consumer credit reporting during the pandemic.
- Prohibit debt collection, repossession, and garnishment of wages.
- Provide \$5 billion in emergency homeless assistance.
- Ban all evictions and foreclosures nationwide.
- Suspend rental & utility payments and provide payment assistance for non-assisted renters.
- Require forbearance for mortgages on rental properties.
- Provide \$10 billion for CDBG.
- Provide \$300 million for servicer coordinators to assist elderly households.
- Provide \$290 million for fair housing enforcement.



HUD & Other Federal Actions

- HUD authorized the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) to implement an immediate foreclosure and eviction moratorium for single family homeowners with FHA-insured mortgages for the next 60 days.
- Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) directed Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac to suspend evictions and foreclosures for any single-family mortgages they back for at least 60 days.
- FHFA Director Mark Calabria announced Fannie and Freddie are working diligently with mortgage servicers to ensure that borrowers facing hardship can get assistance.



Actions Around the Country

- Connecticut: Public Utilities Regulatory Authority ordered utilities to stop shut-off for non-payment.
- New York: state-wide moratorium on evictions
- Washington: state-wide moratorium on evictions for 30 days
- California: \$150 million in emergency funding for new shelters
- Los Angeles: to deliver 6,000 beds at recreation centers for the homeless



Several Localities in FL Moving to Halt Evictions

- Miami-Dade: one of the first localities to issue a moratorium on eviction proceedings
- Orange County
- Hillsborough County
- Broward County: court action

This week, representatives from over 20 legal aid organizations wrote a letter to the FL Supreme Court urging a statewide moratorium on evictions.



Other Florida Actions

- Tallahassee: City-owned utilities will not shut off services for 60 days
- Orange County: announced that several hotels will be shutting down this week
- Many thanks to the major utility companies in FL have announced they will not shut off services Duke Energy, FPL, TICO, Gulf Power
- By and large, local governments are focused on containing the spread first. We expect to see housing-specific actions in the coming days and weeks.

FHFC

- Status of FHFC
- Amendments to RFAs to eliminate local contribution requirement and need for ability to proceed forms
- RFA Deadline Extensions not at this time
- Ongoing consideration of concerns

SHIP Update

- Executive Order 20-52 allows FHFC to waive statutory and rule requirements for SHIP
- Activities for Local Governments to consider in addressing the current emergency:
 - Use your LHAP disaster strategy or other strategies that apply
 - Rental Subsidies
 - Eviction Prevention
 - Foreclosure Prevention/Mortgage Assistance
 - Foreclosure Counseling





SHIP Update

- Waivers that will be considered:
 - 65% homeownership set-aside
 - 75% construction set-aside
- Waivers that will likely *not* be approved:
 - Income set-asides
 - 20% Special Needs
- Extensions

Biggest Needs

- Access to testing
- Identifying the need and articulating the numbers
- Resources and support locally, statewide, and federally (\$\$)
- Access to supplies (homeless and those in housing programs)
- Capacity to social distance, isolate, and quarantine



Highlights

HUD Webinar and Q&A – March 13th

- -Everyone needs to be at the table (health dept., shelters, healthcare, emergency rooms, housing authorities)
- -CDC says there is high likelihood people with COVID-19 with mild to no symptoms will come into shelter
- -**DON'T** exclude people who are symptomatic unless you have been instructed otherwise
- -TB protocols may be helpful
- -Do what works in your community



Highlights

King County

- -Keep behavioral health system open
- -Determine a point of contact at each agency
- -Create a centralized email address to ensure information is flowing efficiently
- -Warehouse for supplies
- -County is funding hotel and looking at other ways to creatively shelter the most vulnerable people



What You Can Do

- Collaborate and Plan
- Know your numbers
 - How many unsheltered?
 - How many 60+
 - How many in emergency shelter?
 - How many beds would you need to accommodate social distancing and quarantine?
- Know your most important questions
- Stay up to date go to the SOURCE!
