Governor's Budget

- Budget Released on Thurs., Dec. 9
- \$355.4 Million- Total Budget Recommendation for Housing
 - SHIP- \$220.5M
 - SAIL- \$95M
- Governor DeSantis budget includes all funds from Sadowski Trust Fund in his 2022-2023 budget

Q & A on Budget

1. What happened in the 2021 Legislative Session?

The Legislature permanently reduced the monies going into the Sadowski Affordable Housing Trust Funds by 50%.

2. What commitment came with this change?

The commitment was that after July 1, 2021, all the remaining distributions to the trust funds would be secure, not swept, and utilized to fully fund the Sadowski Housing Programs (typically known as SHIP and SAIL) thereafter.

3. How do we know how much is available for appropriation in FY 22-23?

The amount available is what is currently in the trust funds, what will come in the remainder of this fiscal year (\$135 to \$175 million), and what is projected to come in from July 1, 2022. to June 20, 2023 (\$209 million).

4. How much is this?

Depending upon revenue estimates, the amount available for appropriation and subject to the commitment is at least the \$337.725 million in the Senate budget, and possibly as high as \$384 million. It is not only the \$209 million projected to be distributed to the trust funds during FY 22-23.

5. How do we know that the House appropriation level is not "full funding"?

Because we know what is in the trust funds and what is projected to come into them—as did the Senate and Governor whose budgets are substantially higher than the House budget.

6. What exactly are the Senate and House housing appropriation levels?

The Senate appropriates \$337.225 million and the House only \$268.1 million. Clearly the House budget is far short of a full appropriation.

7. What should we do?

We urge the House to fully appropriate all the Sadowski state and local housing trust funds for the Sadowski housing programs and urge the Senate to hold firm to their funding level.

Legislative Budget Update

Heading Towards Third Base of the Budget Process

- 2nd Base: Full Appropriations Committee
 - This week the House and Senate passed their respective budgets out of the full Appropriations Committees
- 3rd Base: House and Senate Floor
 - Next week the budgets will be heard on the floor of the House and Senate
- Home: Budget Conference
 - 72-hour "cooling off" period after the Conference Committee Report is released before each chamber can vote on final version of the budget
 - Conference Committee Report must be released by Tuesday, March 8
 - Last day of Regular Session: Friday, March 11, 2022
