







Ken Graham from National Hurricane Center

- Forecasting is becoming more accurate, consistent








As the initial intensity of the storm increases, NHC average track error gets smaller!


It Has Been BUSY



2021 was the 3rd most active in terms of named storms and the 5th costliest at over \$75 billion. (2020 we had the most names, 2005 was 2nd)
