 - Geographic Information Services








Emergence of the Regional Resilience Collaborative (R2C)

- ECFRPC Resolution #03-2018 reaffirmed commitment to regionalism; recognized the relationship between economic development, planning and emergency management; directed to develop a structure and framework for a regional resilience collaborative
 - Increase and amplify resilience efforts to better respond to shocks and stressors
- Mission: Empower communities in East Central Florida to advance resilience strategies that strengthen and protect the built infrastructure and natural environment, enhance health and equity, and ensure a thriving economy.

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






Building Understanding discover common ground

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Regional Perspectives: Desired Outcomes of HARP

Use Housing Resilience Policy Audit to:

- Create a reliable tool that creates a "roadmap" of LG policies to better understand how policies are framed and where mitigation policies exist, can exist, and should exist to best meet LG's needs
 - · Policy Audit of County plans
- Identify where data on vulnerable areas should be incorporated in policy framework
- · Identify critical local government decision-makers and build capacity
 - · Creation of a team whose professional role has an impact on housing resilience
- Identify steps/opportunities to incorporate housing resilience and housing mitigation strategies into policy frameworks
 - · Policy references, addressing DEI, plan making
- Assess where funding for housing is going and how to secure greater funds (BRIC, Resilient Florida, HOME, SHIP) and better target areas in need
- Support other components of the grant project:
 - Regionwide Integrated Climate Vulnerability Assessment
 - · Housing Needs and Flood Vulnerability Assessment

Regional Perspectives: Lessons Learned from HARP

- Limits in prevalence of LGs with resilience/housing mitigation initiatives or champions
 - Requires assessing LG capacity for resilience planning and identification of "Coalition of Willing"
 - Silos: Need for interdisciplinarian coordination
 - Few or no specific housing mitigation policies, tools, task forces, etc.
 - Many desire as well as understand the need to be equitable, resilient, and innovative with affordable housing, but may not be there yet
- Need for clear understanding of policy goals, deadlines, and funding opportunities
- Underlined need to emphasize policy opportunity versus weaknesses



Regional Perspectives: Lessons Learned from HARP

- Need for "Intersection of Housing and Resilience" informational handout to build staff capacity for the exercise and highlight benefits of housing mitigation
 - Home hardening helps residents to shelter in place in the event of a disaster, which can help avoid prolonged displacement and reduce the need for mass shelter care
 - Creates stronger homes that are less vulnerable to climate hazards which reduces the need for home repairs
 - Creates a stronger housing market



Regional Perspectives: Key Takeaways from HARP

The Housing Resilience Policy Audit Exercise showed us:

- How to refine our approach and strategy for developing an Audit Team
 - How to better observe the unique needs of LG partners' geography, bureaucracy, organization and leadership, policy updates and goals, tools for engagement, etc.
- Where to target policy amendments and how to conceptualize and explain the need for change
 - · Policy "Roadmap" and clear layout of policy framework
 - From FHC the many various ways to drive housing mitigation
- The importance of both small and large scall process-change
- How to strengthen the connection between policy development and data-informed processes like vulnerability assessments



Policy Recommendations for Policy Framework

- Top three best performing plans
 - Post Disaster Redevelopment Plan (Adopted 2012)
 - Community Rating System/Floodplain Management Plan
 - Construction and Rehabilitation Standards

Top three areas of improvement

- Comprehensive Plan (Adopted 2009, undergoing update)
- Local Mitigation Strategy (Adopted 2016 and Draft in 2021)
- Local Housing Assistance Plan (2021-2024)

 - Challenges
