



1992: APA and FEMA agree to create new guide on postdisaster recovery

1993: Work begins on the now famous "Green Book" on recovery planning 1998: Publication of *Planning for Post-Disaster Recovery and Reconstruction*Post-1998: PAS Report 483/484 becomes go-to resource for planners working on post-disaster recovery






2000: Congress passes Disaster Mitigation Act 2005: Hurricane Katrina

2005: APA assists New Orleans after
Hurricane Katrina
2007: APA reaches agreement with FEMA
on need for guidance for planners on
hazard mitigation planning
2010: APA completes PAS Report on
Hazard Mitigation





October 2012: Hurricane Sandy April 2013: APA offers recovery training in New York/New Jersey

2009-2010: APA pitches FEMA on overhauling original post-disaster report 2010: Work begins on major new report to include online resources

2013: APA project team becomes instructional team for post-Sandy recovery training

2014: APA releases PAS Report and ancillary online products



Report laid out a coherent theory for distinguishing the functions of recovery planning pre-disaster versus post-disaster








Climate Change and Infrastructure

Two major projects funded by NOAA from 2016 forward explore:


- Climate as a factor in capital improvements, or infrastructure, planning

Part 2: Jim Schwab's "alleged retirement"



Sequence leading to Planning to Turn the Tide

- Jim's retirement from APA as of June 1, 2017
- Sets up Jim Schwab Consulting in September 2017
- Elected chair-elect of APA Hazard Mitigation and Disaster Recovery Planning Division in Fall 2017
- Discussions with David Taylor, Brecksville (OH) High School classmate at 50-year class reunion in summer 2018
- Follow-up discussions into 2019 about possible film project focused on role of planners in addressing disasters
- Initial fundraising begins in late 2019
- Jim takes over as HMDR chair in January 2020
- Pandemic shuts down project in March 2020
- Project resumes in Fall 2021 as pandemic concerns recede
 - Advisory committee formed
 - Fundraising resumes
 - Volunteer teams in development
- Spring 2021: Filming begins
