






Figure 8-1: Cascading benefits of I-Codes



Affordable Housing Needs to Be Built to Withstand Natural Disasters

The devastation Hurricane Dorian caused in the Caribbean and the harm it provoked across the United States' eastern seaboard is a somber reminder of the damage we now expect during hurricane season (which, unfortunately, is just halfway over). Dorian formed almost two years to the date of the landfall of Hurricane Harvey, one of the costliest natural disasters in United States history. In Texas alone, roughly 300,000

New Biden-Harris Administration Housing Supply Action Plan To Help Close the Housing Supply Gap in Five Years



Administration Priorities COV

· Promoting modular, panelized, and manufactured housing - and construction R&D. Innovations in homebuilding, including manufactured, modular, panelized, precut, and additive construction, hold promise for increasing housing productivity and thus housing supply. HUD will highlight these and other technologies that can benefit affordable housing construction during the Innovative Housing Showcase on the National Mall in June 2022. HUD is also working to assess hurdles to modular and panelized housing posed by inconsistent state and local inspection requirements and standards, which limit economies of scale and potential cost savings. The Department of Energy also recently awarded \$32 million in funding to support 30 next-generation building retrofit projects that will dramatically improve affordable housing technologies. These technologies include prefabricated, super-insulated wall retrofit panel blocks and 3Dprinted modular overclad panels.






Responding to the Surfside Collapse

- Ongoing investigation by National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST)
- ► Code Council convened experts to examine potential changes in practice
 - ▶ Developed "Ensuring the Safety of Existing Buildings in Florida" based on International Property Maintenance Code, International Building Code and Florida Building Code
- ▶ Legislature passes, Governor Signs SB-4-D on Building Safety
 - ► Includes requirements based on "Ensuring Safety of Existing Buildings in Florida"
 - ► Condominiums and Co-ops 3 or more stories to have milestone inspections by architect or engineer
 - ▶ 30 years of age and every 10 years thereafter, or
 - ▶ 25 years of age and every 10 years thereafter if the building is located within three miles of a coastline.
 - ▶ Disclosure to unit owners, prospective owners
