Legislative Budget Update

Budget Conference and Final Passage

- Unresolved issues were "bumped" to full Appropriation Chairs
- At one point this week, the budget was closed and SHIP had been reduced to only \$109 million
- The issue was revisited, with SHIP restored to \$209,475,000
- The Conference Committee report was released March 10, locking in the final appropriation levels
- 72-hour "cooling off" period after the Conference Committee Report was released before each chamber can vote on final version of the budget
- Last day of Regular Session: Friday, March 11, 2022
- Session will be extended so that final budget can be adopted Monday, March 14
