



Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM)'s Recovery Bureau works to maximize disaster assistance to eligible public entities, individuals, and families through various State and Federal disaster assistance programs. These programs help to rebuild lives and help communities that have been impacted by a major disaster begin the recovery process. At the request of the Governor, the President may sign a disaster declaration that includes both Individual and Public Assistance programs as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act.

State and local leadership is required to build back better and not just to put things back the way they were.

- Use of more stringent building codes and innovative land-use planning
- Incorporating resilience and mitigation into rebuild
- Managing retreat where necessary
- Staffing full scope of necessary support activities (planning, permitting, inspections, environmental and historic review support, etc.)
- Making housing affordable in the long term



Building affordable housing is important, but also need to make housing affordable in the long-term by considering how best to sustain affordability.

- Use HUD's CDBG-DR affordability requirements as a floor
- Land and site development is expensive so deploy tools and resources to address these costs
- Leverage Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) where possible
- Incorporate renewable energy to limit utility costs over time
- Identify sites close to transit or where transit can be easily directed



Public Housing Rebuilds

- New Orleans
- Galveston

Large Scale Multifamily

- Texas (up to \$25M CDBG-DR per project)
- California (up to 240% of HOME per unit subsidy limit)

Small Rental

- New Jersey (\$50K for repair, \$50K for elevation)
- Louisiana (several programs)
